Main Body of Text	Sidebar
<p>The Wright Flyer</p> <p>Brothers Orville and Wilbur Wright owned a bicycle shop. They wanted to build a flying machine.</p> <p>They studied and built gliders.</p> <p>Together they built a machine they called a flyer. In 1903 Orville flew it 200 feet (61 meters). Then Wilbur flew it 852 feet (260 m).</p> <p>The Wright brothers had invented the airplane.</p>	<p>The Wright brothers tested as many as 200 wing shapes.</p> <p>In 1908 Charles Furnas was the first airplane passenger. He was the Wright brothers' mechanic.</p>
<p>Passenger Planes</p> <p>The first airplanes had room for only the pilot.</p> <p>Later airplanes had room for passengers and cargo.</p> <p>Passengers fly in airplanes of all sizes today.</p> <p>Small private planes hold only a few passengers.</p> <p>The Airbus A380 is the largest airliner.</p> <p>It holds up to 800 passengers.</p>	<p>The 1903 <i>Flyer</i> is at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington, D.C.</p> <p>The earliest airliners were not heated. Passengers had to wear warm clothes.</p> <p>The Airbus A380 is almost as long as a football field.</p>
